Dear Chairman Smith, Ranking Member Neal, Chairman LaHood, and Ranking Member Davis:

The undersigned 22 organizations are signatories to <u>consensus recommendations</u> for reauthorizing Title IV-B of the Social Security Act. We are writing to express our support for your bipartisan *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act*, which would invest critical new resources in Title IV-B and provide needed policy improvements.

Over the past year, your bipartisan leadership has brought critical attention to the need to reauthorize Title IV-B and better support strong families. The *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act* responds to the three priority areas our consensus recommendations highlighted:

- 1. Family deepening federal support for comprehensive approaches to prevent child welfare system involvement and keep children with their families and in family-based placements as much as possible;
- 2. Mental health policy improvements that complement ongoing mental health efforts by federal policymakers and support a trauma-responsive child welfare system that promotes healing; and
- 3. Workforce investing in a workforce that values and supports thriving families.

This bill would expand by \$10 million annually the Court Improvement Program, which is the only direct child welfare-related federal funding that state and tribal courts receive to manage nearly 600,000 children's cases in court each year. The bill would also expand by \$10 million annually the Regional Partnership Grants, which address the intersection of parental substance use and child welfare involvement. The bill also allocates more IV-B funding for tribes, reduces barriers to tribal participation in IV-B, and supports oversight of implementation of the Indian Child Welfare Act.

Recognizing the vital role of strong families in supporting thriving children, the *Protecting America's Children* by Strengthening Families Act would further bolster the role of Title IV-B in supporting kinship caregivers. It would also create a clear commitment in federal law that poverty is not neglect, by underscoring the role of family preservation services for families experiencing a crisis related to a lack of resources. The bill's new policy and investments in the MaryLee Allen Promoting Safe and Stable Families program would also highlight the role of IV-B in primary prevention, by supporting community-based services and supports that prevent unnecessary child welfare involvement.

Responding to decades of level funding, our consensus recommendation called for new mandatory funding. The *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act* would provide the Promoting Safe and Stable Families program \$85 million annually in needed new mandatory funding.

We support the *Protecting America's Children by Strengthening Families Act* as an important step toward a child welfare system that better supports children and families. We look forward to collaborating with you to ensure the enactment of these critical policies and new investments.
