\$5+ TRILLION IN FUNDING IN 12 MONTHS

- American Rescue Plan - **\$1.9T**
- Consolidated Appropriations Act - **\$868B**
- Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act - **\$483B**
- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act - **\$2T**
- Families First Coronavirus Response Act - **\$192B**
- Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental Appropriations Act - **\$8B**

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| WHAT IS THE CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND?



The CARES Act distributes \$150 billion in Coronavirus Relief Fund to states, tribes, and local government.

The Fund is used in human services to improve telework, enable compliance with COVID-19 public health precautions, and build a recovery plan.

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| CRF REQUIREMENTS



COVID-19 RELATED

Reasonably necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19.



NOT BUDGETED

Expenditures were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020.



INCURRED DURING 2021

Costs were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020 and ends on December 30, 2021 (*extended deadline*).

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| “REASONABLY NECESSARY EXPENDITURE” IN HUMAN SERVICES

LOOK FOR TECHNOLOGY THAT SUPPORTS THIS TYPE OF WORK:

Supporting remote work by establishing telework capabilities

Minimizing worker contact with clients in the field

Converting critical case file documents from paper to digital



Limiting the need for clients to come to the agency

Accessing case information remotely

Automating processes to support surge in applications/intakes

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| AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN – THE \$350B

States: \$195.3 billion
(based on share of unemployment)

Local: \$130.2 billion
(Counties based on population; Cities based on CDBG criteria)

Counties: \$65.1 billion
Cities: \$45.6 billion

Tribal: \$20 billion

Territories: \$4.5 billion

Non-Entitlement Units of Local Government: \$19.5 billion
