INTENT FOR THE EVENT AND CALL FOR PROPOSALS

The ISM conference is hosted by the IT Solutions Management for Human Services (ISM) Affinity Group.

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We are seeking inspiring submissions that:

- Highlight innovative policy, practice, and system approaches to outcome measurement and impact evaluation; data analytics and interoperability; technology and service delivery; community engagement; emergency preparedness and crisis-response; funding and procurement strategies, and other pressing issue areas across the human services ecosystem.
- Elevate the important work of the human services sector in empowering and strengthening families and driving meaningful, sustainable change in our communities as demonstrated in research, program evaluations, project outcomes, success stories.
- Showcasing leadership strategies that foster a sense of resilience, workforce well-being, productive collaboration, and deep impact.

CONTENT WILL BE ORGANIZED AROUND THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- Tech-enabled Innovation: Step into the future of human services and explore how cutting-edge technology is re-defining how agencies can better meet the needs of families. This track explores the world of emergent and disruptive technologies like Artificial Intelligence (AI) that are revolutionizing the design and delivery of state, county, and city human services. Presentations within this track will spotlight cutting-edge advancements in AI, Machine Learning (ML), cloud services, cybersecurity, and more.
- People-Powered Design: Immerse yourself in the transformative power of community-led and co-designed solutions in human services. This track spotlights participatory frameworks and human-centered design (HCD) approaches that are improving human services outcomes and building agency capacity by engaging end-users and placing the community at the heart of collaborative design processes. Presentations will feature community-led solutions that leverage the wisdom of people with lived experience to drive the transformation of human services, making our sector more inclusive, responsive, and effective.
- Cross-Systems Alignment: Accelerate the momentum of collaboration and forge connections across the human services ecosystem. This track illuminates how bridging boundaries across systems can create aligned service delivery frameworks. Presentations will feature systems interoperability and operational change management strategies that break down silos so agencies, systems, and sectors can more easily collaborate to deliver cohesive, comprehensive services to families.

- Evidenced-based Policy: Demystify the world of evidence-based policy and its role in driving innovation in human services. This track unpacks the complexities of the policy landscape that governs the delivery of essential human services programs. Presentations will offer insights into the challenges and opportunities in advancing policies that ensure government services address the needs of America's diverse communities.
- Data-Driven Program Delivery: Elevate the impact of human services to improve outcomes and reduce disparities through data-driven approaches to program delivery. This track focuses on how data sharing, advanced analytics, and evidence-informed practices are shaping service delivery improvements across government to reduce disparities and improve outcomes for all. Presentations will highlight actionable tactics for using data to safeguard privacy, enhance decision-making, measure impact, and foster transparency, setting more equitable, efficient, and effective standards for government program delivery.
