Well-Being Scores

- Well-Being Score at 22 points (lowest). Households qualify for SNAP and OWF.
 - o Homeless
 - No transportation
 - Have debt and not paying
 - No Savings
 - No high school diploma/GED and job training
 - No employment
- Well-Being Score at 50 points. Households have left OWF and qualify for reduced SNAP.
 - Subsidized housing
 - o Available transportation but not always reliable
 - Have debt and behind in payments
 - o Little savings to handle a crisis
 - o High school diploma/GED and some job training
- Well-Being Score at **80 points.** Most all households leave SNAP.
 - Stable housing and not subsidized
 - Mostly reliable transportation
 - Current in all debt payments
 - Some savings to handle a crisis
 - Associate's degree or professional certification
- Well-Being Score at 110 points (highest). No households qualify for SNAP.
 - Stable housing, not subsidized, and cost is less than 1/3rd income
 - Reliable transportation
 - o No debt
 - Savings to handle a crisis and 3 months of expenses
 - o Bachelor's degree or higher
