INTENT FOR THE EVENT & CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

The annual Public Human Services Attorneys (PHSA) Education Conference, produced by the American Public Human Services Association (APHSA), brings together legal practitioners from state, county, city, tribal, territorial, and federal agencies to engage with peers and experts and explore timely, relevant legal topics and emerging trends. The conference is hosted by the PHSA Affinity Group, a network of attorneys dedicated to advancing the legal practice of government human services.

The PHSA Education conference emphasizes development of legal skills and innovative approaches to the design and delivery of state, county, city, tribal, and territorial human services at the intersection of legal compliance, policy, and practice. The conference also highlights timely legal issues across the broader human services landscape and gives attendees the opportunity to earn all of their annual continuing legal education (CLE) credits, including ethics. Participants benefit from meaningful learning, hands-on demonstrations of practical solutions, and genuine peer and networking connections.

Call for Presentations

The PHSA Education Conference brings together human services attorneys from across the field to connect, collaborate, and learn from one another. Human services law covers a diverse range of practice areas. Topics may include Medicaid, child welfare, family services, SNAP/TANF, public health, mental health, intellectual and developmental disabilities, corrections and justice-based programming, and other related areas.

Guided by this year's theme *Achieving New Heights: Guidance for the Ever-Changing Legal Landscape of Human Services Law*, the 2026 PHSA Education Conference Planning Committee is seeking presenters on any of these topic areas, as well as related and emerging subjects such as artificial intelligence, data sharing, innovative program design, and the development of legal standards and practice. We encourage creativity and welcome a variety of formats—hot-topic sessions, cutting-edge or experimental ideas, niche subjects, roundtables, discussion-based forums, and skill- or learning-focused presentations. If you have an idea that can inform, challenge, or inspire your peers, we want to hear it.

 - Which program it will highlight (e.g., Medicaid, child welfare, ethics, SNAP, TANF, juvenile justice, long term care, etc.)

- Content which provides continuing legal education (CLE) units is important.

SUBMISSION TYPES

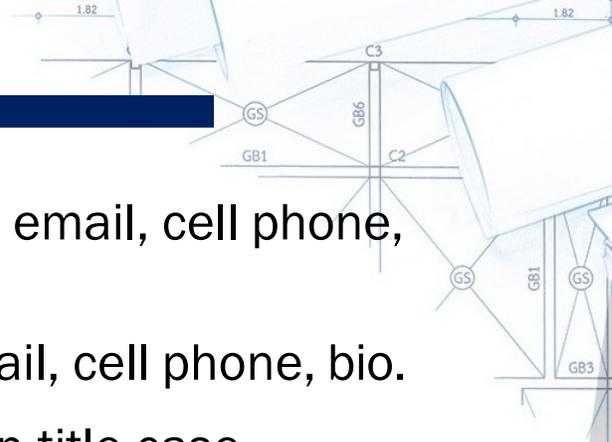
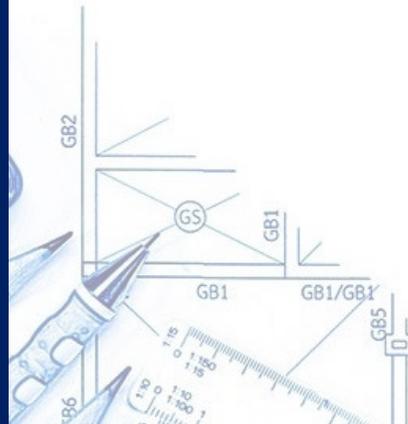
Session Type	Definition
Individual or Panel Presentation	A structured session in which one presenter or a small group of experts share perspectives, insights, and expertise on a specific subject. Sessions may include a moderated discussion, prepared remarks, audience Q&A, and interactive elements designed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of the topic. If a panel presentation, it should include no more than four speakers, including a moderator.
Workshop Session	Following a short presentation, session will engage and interact with participants. A workshop is a collaborative and interactive session where participants engage in hands-on activities, discussions, and exercises to acquire specific skills, knowledge, or practical insights on a particular subject or theme. Workshops aim to foster active learning and skill development through participant involvement and shared experiences.
Roundtable Discussion	A facilitated discussion with subject matter experts (SME) on trending topics impacting legal services.

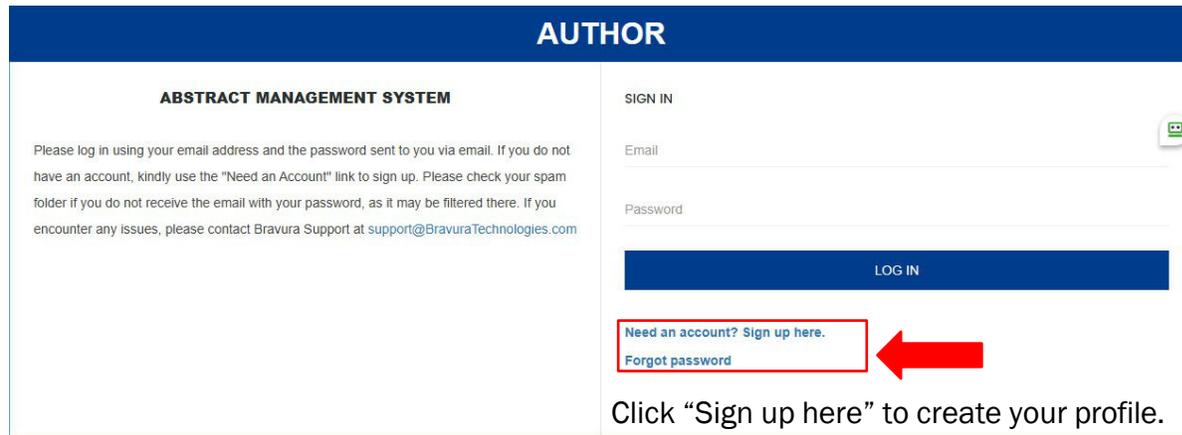

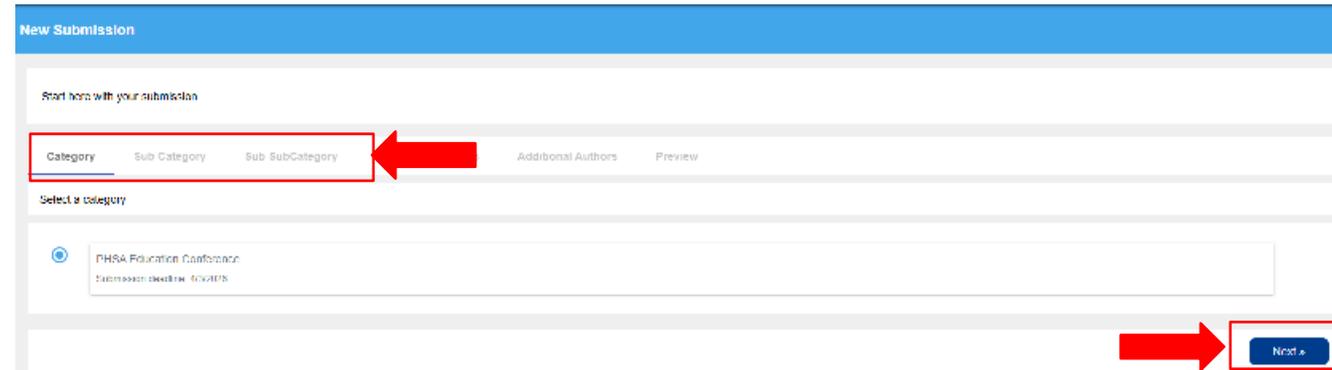
